

Executive Summary

In November 2006, the Northern California Regional Public Safety Training Authority, Joint Powers Authority (Training Authority) received federal grant funding through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) via a Memorandum of Understanding with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department to achieve the following goals:

- Create and present intelligence analyst training which will improve and enhance the analysis and production of intelligence by fusion center analysts.
- Create and present a training program for frontline information providers which will increase their ability to recognize and appropriately report suspicious activities.

The **Intermediate Fusion Center Analyst Training (IFCAT) Program** provided training primarily to qualified fusion center intelligence analysts via instructor-assisted online and classroom courses. It was the only intermediate-level training program for intelligence analysts in the nation. The **Liaison Officer Community Outreach Program (LOCOP)** provided training to public and private sector frontline information providers. The primary goal of the two programs was to increase the quantity and quality of intelligence analysts' intelligence products. The training also aimed to increase the quality and quantity of intelligence and information that was given to liaison officers or fusion center intelligence analysts.

- ***IFCAT Magazine Showcased Graduating Students' Intelligence Products***

IFCAT Magazine was developed to share the written intelligence products developed by our graduating students for the benefit of intelligence analysts and fusion centers nationwide. Six issues were published, showcasing 65 of the best intelligence products developed by students during the program. Feedback on *IFCAT Magazine* from the intelligence community has been outstanding.

- ***Networking and Collaboration Promoted***

The IFCAT Program actively promoted the value of networking and collaboration within the intelligence community. As a direct result of the IFCAT Program, analysts from the following states worked together on areas of mutual interest, including:

- Ohio and Nebraska: Somali-based gangs with a potential link to terrorism
- Minnesota and Pennsylvania: Critical infrastructure assessments on shopping malls
- Mississippi and New Jersey: Sovereign Citizens
- Arizona, California, Missouri, Illinois and Nevada: Russian organized crime
- Iowa and California: Drug trafficking
- New York Army National Guard and FBI: Gangs in the military
- Utah and Illinois: Regional gang issues

- ***IFCAT Incorporated Common Competencies***

The IFCAT Program incorporated the competencies identified in the Common Competencies for State, Local and Tribal Intelligence Analysts (June 2010) developed by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and the U.S. Department of Justice Global Justice Information Sharing Initiative. By incorporating these competencies the IFCAT program helps ensure that analysts have a common skill set when working in fusion centers and law enforcement analytic environments, such as law enforcement intelligence units.

- ***Thesis Recognized IFCAT Program***

In 2011, Brian Dietzman, Major, U.S. Army, submitted his thesis titled *Intelligence Analysts at the State and Major Urban Area Fusion Centers: An Evaluation of the Education and Training Requirements*, to the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College.

Major Dietzman was very supportive of the IFCAT Program and in his thesis said “[IFCAT] needs to continue and expand, as it meets the common competencies requirement, provides a good mix of in-residence instructions...and instructor facilitated distance learning between the in-residence modules. Numerous analysts stated it was an outstanding course, some saying it was the best they had attended as part of their training programs...IFCAT was repeatedly identified as one of the most useful courses the intelligence analysts had attended. This program must be incorporated into all intelligence analysts' career progression...”

- **IFCAT Certified by IALEIA and CA POST**

IFCAT was the only intermediate course to be certified by the International Association of Law Enforcement Intelligence Analysts (IALEIA). IFCAT was the first instructor assisted online course to be certified by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (CA POST). Past graduates of IFCAT also received graduate-level accreditation through Grand Canyon University.

- ***Smart Phone Application Developed to Support Community Training and Reporting***

A smart phone application was developed to expand community training and reporting. The application was designed to promote the concept, "***If You See Something, Say Something***™," which is an integral component of the LOCOP training. It was designed to present frontline information providers with training and information sharing protocols to expand their ability to recognize and appropriately report suspicious activities.

- ***Student Testimonials Reflect Program Success***

The following student comments were provided via **IFCAT course evaluations**:

- ***Continuation of IFCAT Curriculum***

One of the grant requirements is the perpetuation of training upon completion of the grant funding. During 2009, IFCAT was scheduled for DHS continuation funding. The national fiscal downturn generated a change in DHS philosophy and only congressionally budget funded programs received 2011 funding. DHS directed the Training Authority to provide copies of all curriculum and supporting materials to Louisiana State University as that organization received federal funding. However, LSU's funding was only for a basic course. The current mission of the Training Authority does not support a national training program. SRA International is prepared to assume the role of national training provider.

NCRPSTA Membership and Facility Use Fee Schedule

BACKGROUND

In June 2009, the JPA Board was presented with a proposed Membership and Facility Use Fee schedule. This was a revision and update to the previously adopted Fee Schedule adopted by the Board in March 2007. This schedule has been updated on two previous occasions, November 2009 – updated to include additional range facilities and in January 2010 updated to include the “Live-Fire” Shoot House.

In August of 2010, the Board of Directors adopted fees for the use of Classrooms 111, 124, 130, 149, Training Ground (Formerly the Grinder”), CONEX City, B684 – East End and misc. Physical Training Areas (i.e. track, weight room).

DISCUSSION

Additional areas and classrooms have been identified as areas suitable for training and thus facility use fees would apply for those non-member agencies.

**These areas include: Room 149 with a capacity of 70 at \$400.00 per day and Room 136 seating 40 and fees set at \$400.00.



TOPIC

Adopt a Mission Statement to advance the vision and progress of the Northern California Regional Public Safety Training Authority.

BACKGROUND

The original JPA founders envisioned a regional public safety training college, so that public safety training needs could be delivered to more than the JPA member agencies. While the scope of the vision was in the best interest of Public Safety, the reality of expanding the scope of training beyond the member agencies has not been fully satisfied.

DISCUSSION

Currently, the JPA is perceived as only being able to support the member agencies training needs with facility access. The Planning Team met and is providing the Board of Directors a Mission Statement (attached), that will allow the Training Authority to alter the perception of a member only facility, to that of a capable training facility that can meet the needs of professional Public Safety Training for the Western States.


