

Critical Incident Response Training for Managers and Supervisors

Critical Incident Response for Supervisors and Managers is a comprehensive 32 hour course designed to provide law enforcement officers, dispatchers, supervisors, managers and executives with a fundamental response plan that can be applied to a wide variety of critical events.

This course is designed to give all responding personnel, regardless of their rank or agency, the ability to work together during large-scale emergency events. Students will be introduced to a “4-step critical incident response plan” that has been successfully implemented in hundreds of criminal, man-made and natural disasters throughout the United States. The course examines the most common failures in critical incidents and provides a proven methodology to quickly stabilize and organize these events.

This class is POST Plan III Certified and is reimbursable to the agency for travel, lodging, per diem, etc. - tuition is Free for CA POST Agencies.

The students will participate in a series of scenario driven exercises, designed to demonstrate the management of various critical incidents or disasters that could affect your jurisdiction.

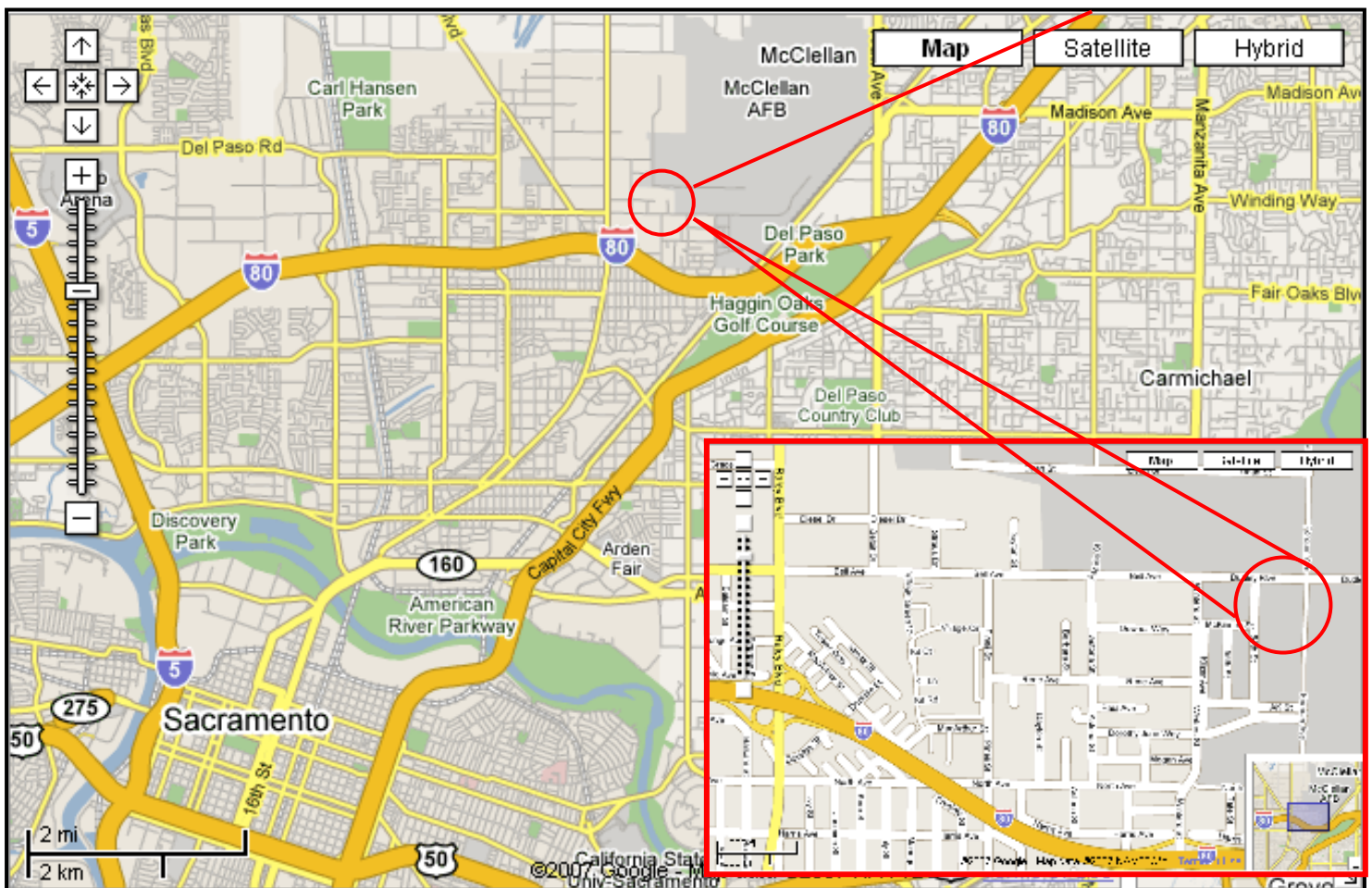

Directions

- From Interstate 80, take the Winters Street exit & head north to McClellan Park Drive
- Turn right (eastbound) onto McClellan Park Drive
- Turn left (northbound) onto 54th Street, the first street you come to, or onto Forcum Avenue, the street McClellan Park Drive dead ends into
- The building is located between 54th Street and Forcum Avenue (east side of 54th Street and west side of Forcum Avenue) and has a black wrought iron fence around it. The address is **3720 Dudley Boulevard**

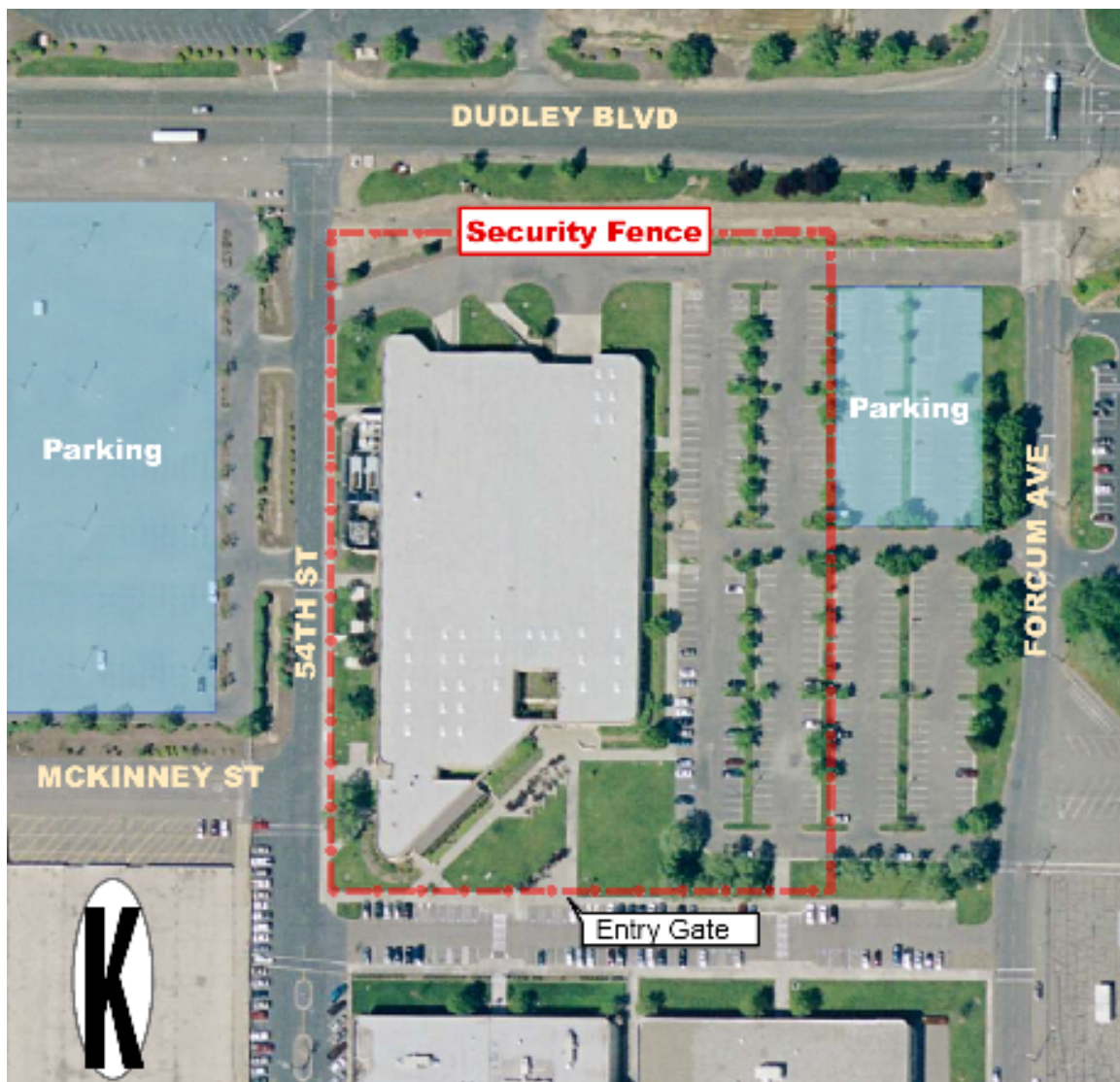


POST Reimbursement

- Please have the student(s) bring a POST form 2-273, Training Reimbursement Request, to the class and turn it in to the instructor. For POST certified agencies there is no tuition cost. The TRR forms will be required if you are claiming reimbursement for travel, lodging, etc

Vehicle Parking

- Students (civilian, sworn, local, State or Federal) attending training on site will not be permitted to park inside secure areas while attending training.
- *Do not follow employees into the inner secured parking area. This area is designed for permanent tenants' only or for official vehicles registered by the tenants with security staff.*
- Students will park outside of the security gates on the east side or west side of the building and walk through the main perimeter entrance (walking gate) on the **south side** of the building (signage will direct students and visitors to this gate).
- For students who are on-duty and required to respond to an incident, recommended parking is on the **west side** - it will provide quicker access to your vehicle.



Identification Cards

- Students must bring their **drivers license** and **agency identification card** with them to enter into the building.
- Students will be required to check in with the security staff and will be issued a Temporary Student Identification card that identifies them as a "Student."
- *Identification must be worn and plainly visible at all times within the building.*
- This identification card will be issued to you for the duration of the class and must be turned back in to Security at the end of the day.

Weapons/Guns

- Students are required to leave their weapons locked in their vehicles or left with their agencies. We can accommodate up to 24 guns, however, in gun lockers on a first come, first served basis.
