Automated Critical Asset Management System (ACAMS)

This 32-hour course provides attendees with training in the use of the Automated Critical Incident Management System (ACAMS). ACAMS is a tool to be used by public safety personnel to conduct vulnerability assessments or support Critical Infrastructure Protection programs. Topics include inventorying of critical assets, usage of Asset Manager Questionnaire and Initial Asset Visit data bases to capture vulnerability information, and briefing management on potential security enhancements

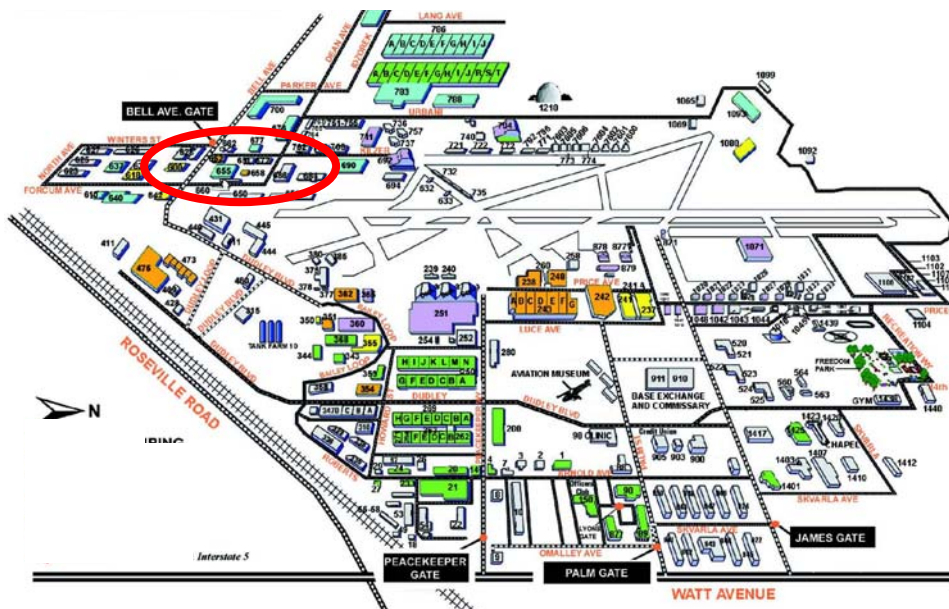
